

OPIOID OVERDOSES CAN HAPPEN TO ANYONE, ANYWHERE, AT ANY TIME^{*,1}

75% of opioid overdose deaths occur outside of a medical setting, and **more than half occur at home**^{2,3}

Despite bystanders being present at nearly half of fatal opioid overdoses, regardless of cause, **< 5%** of cases⁴ naloxone was only administered in

KNOW THE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF AN OPIOID OVERDOSE:⁵



Unresponsive

Will not wake up or respond to a loud voice



Breathing is very slow, uneven, or has stopped



"Pinpoint Pupils"

Center part of eye is very small



Fingernails and lips turning blue or purple
