Strong majority of Canadians would support or somewhat support a government that legalized mushroom-based psilocybin-assisted psychotherapy to improve the quality of life for terminally ill patients.





## **Key Findings**

### USE OF PSILOCYBIN-ASSISTED THERAPY

Canadians are more likely to agree (40%) or somewhat agree (28%) that they are open to Canadians being allowed to use mushroom-based psilocybin-assisted psychotherapy as part of their therapy, while just over half of Canadians each agree or somewhat agree that these treatments can help people when used in conjunction with therapy and that they can have a therapeutic benefit.

### APPROVAL OF USES FOR PSILOCYBIN-ASSISTED THERAPY

Canadians have higher intensity of approval for allowing use of psilocybin-assisted therapy for people suffering from a terminal illness (62% approve; 20% somewhat approve) compared to allowing it for Post-Traumatic Stress Disorders (41% approve; 28% somewhat approve).

### SUPPORT FOR GOVERNMENT LEGALIZING PSILOCYBIN-ASSISTED THERAPY

A strong majority of Canadians would support (56%) or somewhat support (22%) a government that legalized mushroombased psilocybin-assisted psychotherapy to improve the quality of life for terminally ill patients, and they are three times more likely to say they would be more likely (21%) rather than less likely (seven per cent) to support a Canadian political party if it came out in favor of psilocybin-assisted psychotherapy.




### GOVERNMENT EXPANDING LEGAL ACCESS TO MAID

Almost two thirds of Canadians believe that the government should also expand legal access to psilocybin-assisted psychotherapy for those who quality under the Medical Assistance in Dying rules (64%), while seven per cent say they should not expand access and close to three in ten are unsure.





## Awareness of mushroom-based psilocybin-assisted psychotherapy



Our next few questions are about psilocybin-assisted psychotherapy, which is a therapy provided by a qualified medical practitioner that uses an active ingredient found in mushrooms called psilocybin. Psilocybin-assisted psychotherapy has shown promising results and appears to be effective in treating depression, end-of-life anxiety, and addiction. Psilocybin is currently a controlled substance in Canada and can only be accessed through a Health Canada special medical exemption for therapeutic treatment.





















Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and celllines) random telephone survey of 1,051 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between June 30<sup>th</sup> and July 5<sup>th</sup>, 2021 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey. The sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1,051 Canadians is  $\pm 3.1$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
