Ocugen/Harris Poll Finds Americans Want More COVID-19 Vaccine Options

New data from a survey conducted online by The Harris Poll February 3-7, 2022, among over 2,000 U.S. adults, on behalf of Ocugen, Inc. show Americans still want more COVID-19 vaccine options to choose from more than one year after the first COVID-19 vaccination was administered in the United States and over 545 million doses later. As the focus remains on increasing vaccination rates of Americans with the nation's attention concentrated on children under 5 years of age, many Americans seem to be in search of the comfort of tradition when it comes to vaccine options.

» 38% of parents with children age 5 and under say they definitely/probably will not get their children age 5 and under vaccinated with the existing vaccines if/when eligible
